Papal Visit

There will be a Holy Hour to pray for the success of the Visit of His Holiness, Pope Benedict XVI this Thursday 9th September beginning at 7pm. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will continue until 9pm when we will end with Night Prayer and Benediction. Confessions will be heard during this evening of prayer. Please come for part or all of this devotion whether or not you will be at Bellahouston.

Music for the Papal Mass

The first practice for the music at the Papal Mass will be at 5pm this Sunday. All parishioners are invited to attend and learn some of the music and it is an opportunity to offer some time to God for the success of the visit.

Getting to know the Pope

In celebrating Mass, Pope Benedict will give witness to his role in leading the Church throughout the world. Some of the largest gatherings in recent world history have been at celebrations of the Eucharist presided over by the Pope.

Welcomers
