Think Vocations

Thursdays will be celebrated in St. Cadoc's as a Day of Prayer for Priests. Parishioners are asked to pray this week for: Fr. John Keenan, LL.B., Ph.L., S.T.B., who was born in Glasgow in 1964 and who had his secondary education at the Salesian College in Cheshire. After graduating in Law at the University of Glasgow, he prepared for the priesthood at the Pontifical Scots College and the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. He was ordained priest in the church of St. Gregory, Wyndford on 9th July 1995 by His Eminence Thomas Joseph Cardinal Winning, Archbishop of Glasgow. Having served in various parishes in the Archdiocese, Fr. Keenan is now chaplain and Parish Priest at the University of Glasgow. His brother Gerard and his family are resident in St. Cadoc's Parish.

Pope Benedict to the Scottish Bishops

A renewed focus on lay apostolate will help to clarify the roles of clergy and laity and so give strong impetus to the task of evangelizing society.

That task requires a readiness to grapple firmly with the challenges presented by the increasing tide of secularism in your country. Support for euthanasia strikes at the very heart of the Christian understanding of the dignity of human life. Recent developments in medical ethics and some of the practices advocated in the field of embryology give cause for great concern. If the Church's teaching is compromised, even slightly, in one such area, then it becomes hard to defend the fullness of Catholic doctrine in an integral manner. Pastors of the Church, therefore, must continually call the faithful to complete fidelity to the Church's Magisterium, while at the same time upholding and defending the Church's right to live freely in society according to her beliefs.

Revised Rites

The broader vocabulary of the new translation will reflect the extensive vocabulary of the Latin. Latin sometimes has different words to express different meanings or nuances. So, for example, we might use the same word to express different notions. E.g. *I love my children. I love ice cream.* We will find a variety of English words to match these occurrences which will not only avoid needless repetition but will give a freshness and accuracy which is missing in the present texts.

Gift Aid

Next Sunday at the end of Mass there will be a brief talk to encourage more parishioners to join the Gift Aid programme. This is an excellent method of increasing the amount you give to the parish, usually without it costing you an extra penny! Gift Aid raises about £20,000 per annum for the parish. The bulk of this money is invested in a high interest account with other parishes and the Diocese of Paisley and **is not used for the day to day running expenses** of the parish. Neither Canon Cunningham nor I have used these funds which will be used mainly for any future major work necessary on the church building. 24% of the total parish collection, including standing orders, is levied and paid to the Diocese for its running costs and those of the Bishops' Conference. Additionally a proportion of each week's collection is paid into the Diocesan Building fund.
